The 2015 Nepal earthquake , which killed more than 7,000 people and injured more than twice as many, occurred at 11:56 NST on 25 April, with a moment magnitude of 7.8M_w or 8.1M_s. Its epicenter was the village of Barpak, Gorkha district, and its hypocenter was at a depth of approximately 15 km.

It was the most powerful disaster to strike Nepal since 1934. Some casualties have been reported in the adjoining areas of India, China, and Bangladesh. Hundreds of thousands of houses were destroyed rendering people homeless with entire villages flattened across many districts of the country. Continued aftershocks occurred throughout Nepal, with one shock reaching a magnitude of 6.7 on 26 April at 12:54:08 NST. The country is at continued risk of landslides as well.

Geophysicists and other experts had warned for decades that Nepal was vulnerable to a deadly earthquake, particularly because of its geology, urbanization, and architecture. In 2013, in an interview with seismologist Vinod Kumar Gaur, *The Hindu* quoted him as saying, "Calculations show that there is sufficient accumulated energy now to produce an 8 magnitude earthquake. I cannot say when. It may not happen tomorrow, but it could possibly happen sometime this century, or wait longer to produce a much larger one". According to Brian Tucker, founder of a nonprofit organization devoted to reducing casualties from natural disasters, some government officials had expressed confidence that such an earthquake would not occur again. Tucker recounted a conversation he had had with a government official in the 1990s who said, "We don't have to worry about earthquakes anymore, because we already had an earthquake"; the previous earthquake to which he referred occurred in 1934.
