

The Second Term Exam of English

Part One: Reading: (15 pts) Read the text and do the activities

There has been a lot of talk lately in the U.S.A about the importance of teaching values in the classroom. Values are characteristics such as honesty, kindness, hard work, and integrity. Actually, I am inclined to believe that the classroom should not be responsible to make sure that these ideas are taught. In other words, school budgets are already stretched so thin that schools do not have the needed resources to teach values adequately. Students need consistent modelling and instruction on these life skills, things which cannot be done with the current budgets given to public schools.

In a nutshell, let the schools support these values but focus more on the curriculum.
