Teachers in some secondary schools in Britain are worried that **their** jobs may become impossible soon if discipline is not established in the classrooms. In some difficult schools, mostly in large cities, a small minority of pupils cause such extensive disturbance during the lessons that the effectiveness of the teaching is very much reduced.

Some within the teacher's Unions place the responsibility for this on the tolerance of modern society. When small children are continually given every encouragement to express their individuality without restriction, they naturally show a reluctance to accept the disciplinary standards of their school when they grow older. Furthermore, modern teaching techniques, **which** appear to stress personal enjoyment at the expense of serious academic work, might be developing the child's selfishness, instead of teaching him to put the interests of the community in which believes before his own.

Perhaps a solution to the problem is an improvement in facilities for the psychological guidance of these difficult children or a more cooperative relationship between these schools and the parents, because the parents may be responsible for the aggressiveness of their children. But some of us share the belief that ought t be a return to more 'old-fashioned' methods. At present, in some schools, misbehavior by a child cannot even be punished by a slap, but I personally feel that the re-introduction of the cane might produce the desired results.
