During his lifetime, Darwish published more than 30 volumes of poetry and 8 books of prose. He wrote in Arabic, English, French and Hebrew. He was also the editor of several literary magazines in Palestine. Mahmoud Darwish died on August 9th, 2008 in Houston, Texas, in the United States three days after heart surgery.
